Marketing Efforts

In our June newsletter, we made you aware of a new barrier to distributing Loaves & Fishes in some prisons. The switching of inmate communications to all-electronic formats means that printed materials can no longer be sent to these particular facilities.

This comes at a time when we have been unusually blessed with financial support for our work. As a result, we have for the first time been able to expend resources on marketing the magazine. Our office staff have been working to create state-by-state lists of federal, state, and local prisons, and are creating sample packets including strive to give them Jesus' words of life in a way that helps them to become better disciples of the Master Teacher. For example, in issue 52 that is currently being distributed, there is teaching on nonresistance and having a vision for our finances.

Those of us that are on the outside have many ways to access these words of eternal life. We have multiple Bibles in our possessions, we can attend the church of our choosing, we can listen to upbuilding content from any number of channels. But in prison, it is hard to find resources that teach continued discipleship. Your support in distributing the magazine, persevering in prayer, donating funds, and volunteering helps us to fulfill our mission of providing "Discipleship Resources for People in Prison."

Current Publishing Status

Issue 52 was shipped in July. The total project cost, including printing, shipping, and production was approximately \$30,000. For approximately 70,000 copies, the cost per magazine was about 43¢.



We are currently compiling issue 53. The theme will be Christian discipleship, and we will address topics such as everyday obedience, needing others, following

and being good examples, and the need for mentoring. For Christians in prison, there is an incredible need for follow-up teaching, and there is no end to the opportunity that Christian inmates have to provide encouragement and mentorship to others. We are excited to bring this topic to our readers.

Our available funds for the next issue are currently around \$22,000. This will cover our printing cost for issue 53, and by September, we hope to raise an additional \$10,000-12,000 to fully fund the shipping and other administrative expenses and get the issue out on time. Again, we are deeply grateful for the kindness of our donors.
